

During the 2013-14 reporting period, the Foundation for Post Conflict Development (FPCD) has engaged in a number of activities that underscore its on-going commitment to UNAI and its principles. The following examples stand out as particularly notable:



In 2011 and under the supervision of UNAI, FPCD and the African Union organized the Alpine Youth Challenge. The event, which featured a collection of UN Ambassadors, sportspersons, and other successful people, encouraged young people that “Everything is possible”.

Since then, the FPCD has been reaching out to international institutions and NGOs, and plans to organize a panel discussion on the importance of inter-cultural dialogue and understanding for peace in post conflict situations. Plans for collaboration have been made, for example, with the Archdiocese of Monaco and IMAN Foundation—a non-profit organization dedicated to strengthening international understanding and coexistence through the exchange of ideas, people, culture, and religion.

Throughout its existence, FPCD has been responsible for the construction of three youth centers and two maternity clinics, while overseeing an extensive 7-year environmental program that created jobs, contributed to sustainable development, saved lives, and protected human rights. Furthermore, FPCD is continually engaged in educating and expanding its developmental efforts.
